## **Ecclesiastes 4:8**

Eccl 4:8 (HCSB) There is a person without a companion, without even a son or brother, and though there is no end to all his struggles, his eyes are still not content with riches. "So who am I struggling for," he asks, "and depriving myself from good?" This too is futile and a miserable task.

Eccl 4:8 (Msg) I turned my head and saw yet another wisp of smoke on its way to nothingness: a solitary person, completely alone—no children, no family, no friends—yet working obsessively late into the night, compulsively greedy for more and more, never bothering to ask, "Why am I working like a dog, never having any fun? And who cares?" More smoke. A bad business.

## FOUR DEVASTATING HANDICAPS

- 1. He has no <u>relationships</u>. Eccl 4:8 "There is a person without a companion"
- 2. He has no helping hand. ...there is no end to his struggles...
- 3. He has no answers. "So who am I struggling for?"
- 4. He has no purpose. This too is futile and a miserable task.

THE SOLUTION: <u>Do Life Together</u> (<u>Actively Participate in a LIFE Group</u>)

We see the first LIFE Groups in Acts 2:42-47.

- 1. LIFE Groups provide a community to <u>develop relationships</u>. (Acts 2:42; 1 Cor 12:13-21)
- 2. LIFE Groups provide an organization to receive/give a helping hand. (Acts 2:44-45)
- 3. LIFE Groups provide a study group to <u>find answers in the Scriptures</u>. (Acts 2:42)
- 4. LIFE Groups provide a team to work/fight/give to accomplish God's purpose. (Acts 2:46-47; Matt 28:18-20; Acts 1:8)

LIFE Groups provide everything that our man in Ecclesiastes was missing.
